STUDENTS WILL DECODE NEW & MULTI-MEANING WORDS.

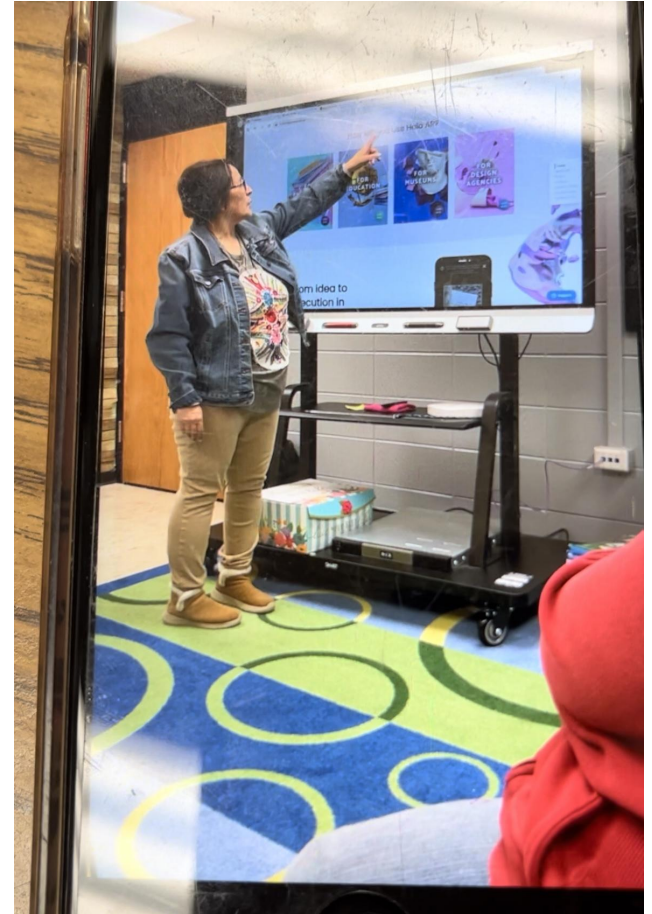
RL. 7.4 – Determine the meaning of words & phrases used in a text.

Watch videos on Halo AR & Youtube.

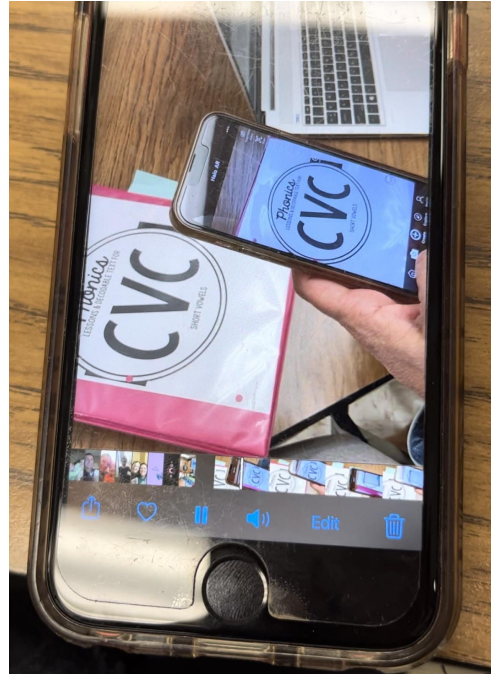


STEPS TO MAKE A AR BOOK:

4. Record audio or a video of you reading the book.
5. CREATE a AR book with the Halo AR app.
6. Try it out!

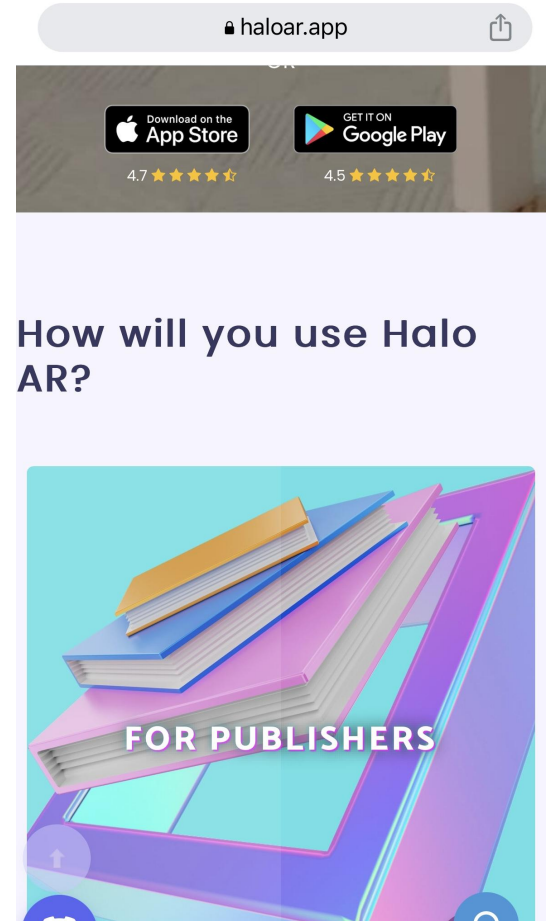
1. GET A BOOK.

Choose a book or passage in a book to use as a trigger.



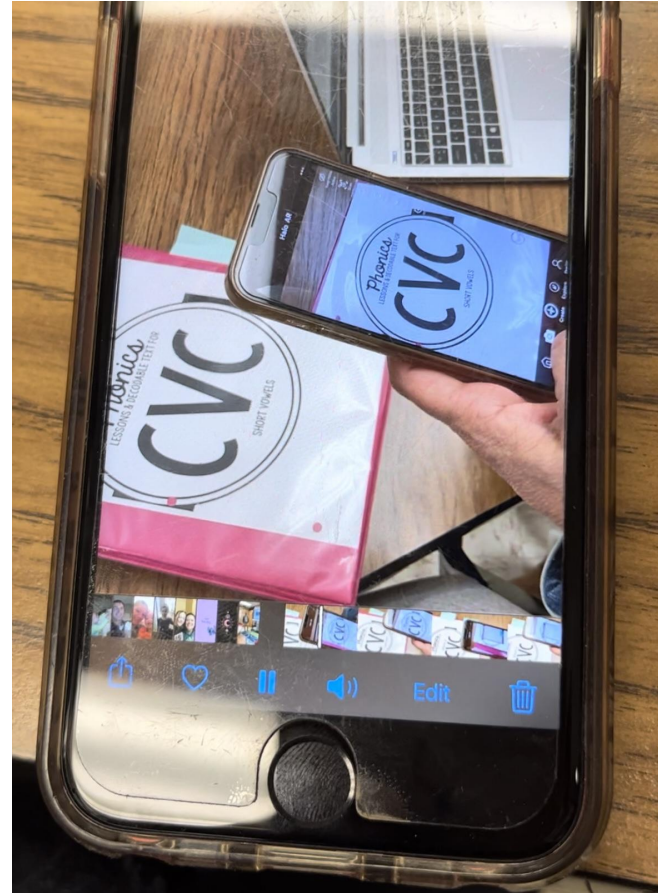
DOWNLOAD THE HALO AR APP:

At the app store or the website.




TAKE A PICTURE OF A "TRIGGER."

FIND YOUR OVERLAY:

1. Record audio or a video of you reading the book.

Lin's list of gifts would be good for her to have fun with.

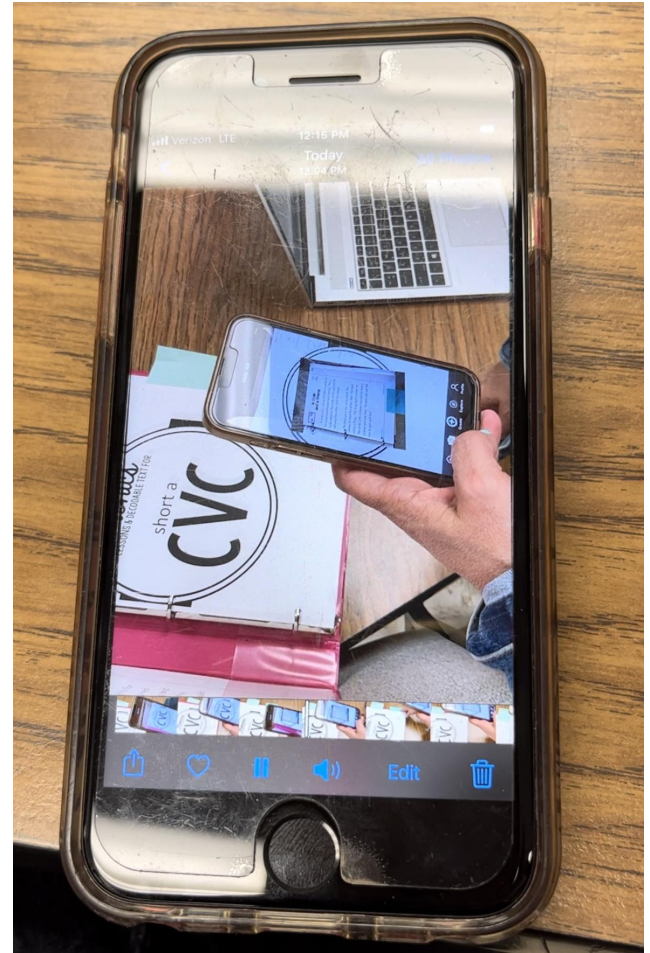
